In Memory Of Hellon Catlett

As many of you know, Hellon was well known for her Banana Nut Bread. She kept her Tue painting group supplied with her delicious bread and there was always some stuck away in the refrigerator. Here is her recipe for those that want it.

Banana Nut Bread

2 sticks butter	2 tsp. baking soda
3 C. sugar	1 tsp. vanilla
4 lg. eggs	3 C. flour
4 lg. ripe bananas	1 C. chopped nuts (pecan or walnuts)
¼ C. buttermilk	dash of salt

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Grease 2 large loaf pans and line the bottom of the pans with wax paper; Cream butter and sugar together. Add eggs, mashed bananas and mix well. Add flour, soda, salt, buttermilk, vanilla and nuts. Mix well. Pour into prepared pans and bake one hour and fifteen minutes or until center of loaf is done. Run knife around edges of loaf and turn out on cooling rack. Remove wax paper, when cool wrap with saran wrap and put in zip lock bags. Refrigerate or freeze. Remember every oven is different, so don't overcook or it will be dry.
